Pedro, a Pickled Pet Monkey and a stuffed crocodile are found amongst the clutter of an old style Indiana Jones explorer.

When he was alive Pedro was a beloved pet monkey. The best friend of an old school explorer who lived abroad most of his life collecting and studying weird and wonderful wildlife. Pedro and his owner came to Britain when his owner returned in his twilight years and Pedro was considered part of the family - having bed-time stories read to him (we believe is favourite story was Jungle Book) and even sending Christmas cards to friends with his photo inside.

Such is the problem with what to do with Pedro that he currently resides in Angela's downstairs cloakroom in his pickling jar in a bucket, waiting for someone to find him a home.

Clare Baker who runs the Clutter Clearing Consultancy that were called in to help with this unusual find explains 'we're used to working with people who need help with sorting through the belongings of a loved one after they have passed away. We're used to sentimental attachments for friends and relatives, and we're used to finding treasures amongst the clutter, but this is the first time we've come across a pickled pet, and particularly one that we don't know how to dispose of. We give people advice on what to do with unwanted clutter, but we're really struggling with this one. What is even more strange is the Christmas cards that Pedro used to send - I wonder just how many friends Pedro had as I doubt there are many pet monkeys in the UK.'

Angela Twiselton, the Consultant who helped clear the clutter and discover Pedro said 'I knew my dad had some unusual friends, but I never knew Pedro when he was alive. It's lovely to think that he cared so much about him that he had him pickled. Who knows, maybe Michael Jackson will do the same with Bubbles who, incidentally we haven't heard much about lately. However, there's the practical problem now of what to do with Pedro. If anyone has any ideas we'd love to know.'
